## INSOLVENCY STATISTICS FEB 2019 - FEB 2022 (8)



Insolvency figures released for February 2022\* by the Government's Insolvency Service showed corporate insolvencies more than doubled compared to the same month last year (1515 in February 2022 and 685 in February 2021). <sup>(8)</sup>

The number of registered company insolvencies in February 2022 was similar to pre-pandemic levels, driven by a higher number of CVLs. <sup>(8)</sup>


